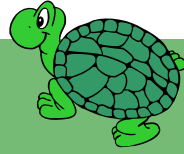

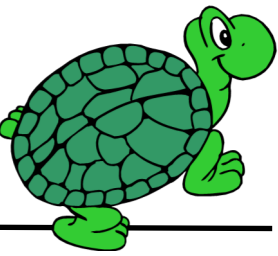

Turtle Creek High School Marks 100th Birthday



This year Woodland Hills Academy is marking the centennial of the construction of the school building. Elegantly surrounded by a park-like lawn, the school was built on a former baseball field. The School District of the Borough of Turtle Creek purchased the lot from Rachel McMasters Miller on November 16, 1915 for \$45,260. (Adjusted for inflation, this would come to just over one million dollars!) The cornerstone was placed in August 1917, and construction was completed in 1918.

Over its 100 years, Turtle Creek High School has transitioned from a large high school, experienced building additions, renovations, district mergers, the 'Junior High Concept', been threatened with demolition and closure, and since 2009 has been thriving under the 'Academy' concept. Over the years the building has been known as Union High School, Turtle Creek High School, Turtle Creek Area High School, East Junior High School 'East', and now Woodland Hills Academy.

As testament to its proud standing in Turtle Creek, the building entrance is distinguished with a display of plaques from the National Register of Historic Places (2007), and the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation (2009). The building and lawn area qualified for national and local recognition as an example of the City Beautiful Movement popular in pre-1920s America. This concept fostered the use of classical building design and green space to enhance the learning environment and provide a park-like space for community use.

With the latest renovation completed in 2016, physical and technical upgrades have prepared the building and grounds for a success in educating Woodland Hills Academy students for the next 100 years.
